Pastor's Report 2021

Each team or committee was charged with making their report for this year's annual meeting a "Gratitude Report." We invited everyone to spend some time reflecting on the people and situations or experiences from 2021 that caused them to thank God and express gratitude. I want to accept that invitation as well.

First, although it was hard to **say goodbye to long-standing church staff colleagues** – Emily Thomas-Harned, Cindi Kyte and Steve Koch – I feel deep gratitude for the years I was able to serve alongside these ministry partners. Each one fulfilled God's call to leadership, service and discipleship with diligence, faithfulness and creativity. Our congregation and community is both better and blessed because of the good work of Emily, Cindi, and Steve. It is a rare thing to have gotten to work with the same team for almost 2 decades, so I feel blessed and grateful for that foundation, which gives us a firm footing to step into 2022.

I am also so **very grateful for the staff I continue to work** with on a daily and weekly basis.

Rick is a lot of fun and we enjoy some give-and-take. I am continually appreciative of the great job he does that often goes unnoticed. Rick is one who, whenever given a task, he is on it immediately. He is also one who does not wait to be asked; but instead, if he sees there is a need, he does it.

Donna has been a wonderful addition to our staff as Administrative Assistant. While Emily was still holding that position, she was always fond of saying "no two days are the same" – and that is still true! Each day and each month brings unique situations and projects for Donna to learn and accomplish. Donna is a great team player, persistent in problem-solving, and committed to making sure that each task is finished well.

When I announced that **Sue** had called me early one Sunday morning to explain that she would not be able to play the organ that morning, she confessed that this was the second time that had happened in 63 years. We dubbed her the *Iron Organist* that morning! Not only is Sue consistent, but she is an excellent musician whose breadth and depth of musical gifting and knowledge means that she is always able to find just the right piece for our worship.

Alex has continued to do youth ministry but, given that it is very different now than when it was fully in-person, Alex has offered his gifts in many other aspects of the life of our congregation. He utilizes his organization skills in very valuable ways. He helped plan and organize confirmation, working with families to determine if Zoom would work and then setting up the schedule. He has edited our worship services since the early days of COVID when we were fully online and did an excellent job. Then, when we returned to in-person services, Alex organized and trained the Tech Team so that we could move to live-streaming. If he sees a place where we need organization, he offers that. Along with learning Mailchimp and helping with congregation emails, he shared a communication grid to help us be consistent with the info we are communicating. We are excited that Alex completed Seminary last spring and is working his way through the ordination exams.

I'm grateful for **Gwyn** Straker who, when the pandemic first started, shifted our *Seniors in Motion* classes to Zoom, complete with a 15-minute coffee/social time. She continued that through 2021 and I heard from many of the participants of how life-giving that class and social time was during a time of isolation. In addition, people were able to

maintain their strength and mobility—something so important, but challenging to do alone.

I'm grateful for **Abbie** Leithold-Gerzema's faithfulness in creating our visuals for worship. Sometimes it can be easy for us to take that work for granted, but it adds so much value and beauty to our services. I am grateful for her steadfast commitment to all aspects of worship.

I am grateful for **all the members of our church who contribute to our ministry**—whether by calling fellow members, giving, offering their gifts, or volunteering in the different ministries and committees. We truly are a church that is *more than just Sunday morning.*

I was also grateful for our **drive-thru events.** I especially appreciated the opportunities I had to offer Communion whether drive-up on communion Sunday or at a drive-thru event (Ash Wednesday pictured). It was meaningful to look into the eyes of masked friends and speak God's truths in-person, during the height of those days of isolation and quarantine.


While I would have much rather been inperson, I was grateful for the **technology** of **ZOOM** that allowed us to still carry out **Elder/Deacon training, our**



congregational meeting, Session/Deacon/Committee and Presbytery meetings, and Confirmation (pictured). I remember our first ZOOM Confirmation meeting, when most of the students had their screens blacked out. I invited them to turn their cameras

on and we talked about how hard it is to be community when we can't see one another's faces. As their images appeared on the screen in their home setting, I was reminded of how much I appreciate our middle school and high school students, and the importance of the connection and learning we shared in Confirmation class.

This year, like every year, as a pastor I'm invited into families' lives in the most difficult of circumstances: when a



loved one has passed away...And, each time, I am grateful for **the invitation to share in those sacred moments, as well as the trust that is expressed.** Many times the funerals that we offer are of long-standing members—20, 40, 50 years—and I am reminded that **the ministry in which we engage is built upon the shoulders of those who ministered before us, as well as God's work through them... and now through us.**

Lastly, I continue to be grateful for **the generosity of our church members.** Once again, even though we've experienced the restrictions of COVID, our members and

friends have stepped up and given financially of their resources, skills, and time. We experienced a year in which we had the resources we needed for ministry, and even a little bit left over. And that, too, is something for which I am very grateful.

As we continue to live in unprecedented times, let us be on the watch for God's work in our lives and in the world, remembering to take moments to express our gratitude to God and to those around us.

Music & Worship 2021

Soli Deo Gloria!

The great composer, J.S. Bach, would sign all of his compositions "SDG" for the Latin *Soli Deo Gloria,* meaning "to God be the glory alone". The mini-teams of Music & Worship have continued to quietly serve this year to the glory of God, exemplifying our mission statement, *"We exist to glorify God."* We have much for which to be grateful.

We started the year creating YouTube worship by recording hymns and sermon response songs. Beginning in April 2020, Sue and Abbie would safely meet with singers and other musicians on a monthly basis to make recordings for Alex. While the pandemic prohibited many activities, **it also blessed us by giving our musicians opportunities to serve when they may have not otherwise been able to participate.** Three young adult members joined the music team!

Once we were gathering in the sanctuary for Sunday worship in April 2021, First Pres continued to stream our live services online. Safely masked, distanced, and limiting congregational participation, we were thankful to be worshiping together again in

person. Working with Sue and Abbie, a small group of singers have rotated involvement to provide worship music on Sunday mornings.

Streaming live services also created more opportunities for members to serve. While Alex was on leave this summer, volunteers stepped up to develop a system for improving internet in the sanctuary, developing a process for streaming, and working in the booth on Sunday mornings. We are not a "high tech" church, but our purpose is to involve as many members and friends to worship together in communion, whether in



person or at home, on Sunday mornings or watching online another day—*"inviting all into a transforming relationship with Jesus Christ"*. Online services are an extension and inclusion of our Sunday morning activities, not a "production". While we continue this online ministry, we appreciate your patience as our developing Tech Team learns and grows with the technology (see Tech Team Report for more details).

Especially now that the congregation does not spend as much time in the building, many tasks may go unnoticed, but there have been quiet helpers that decorated the sanctuary and Gathering Area for Christmas, changed paraments, set out communion cups, made and delivered CDs & DVDs of the services, put together worship outlines, gave a Children's Moment, planned and implemented contactless worship activities, and more. We are blessed by these faithful servants who give of their time and talents for the glory of God.

was our first in-person activity of the year and we practiced caution: masking and each working in a zone in the big kitchen to help us keep our distance and stay as safe as possible.

On Easter morning, the team connected with everyone that came to the drive-through event. We hosted the "farewell station", which was the final station of the event. From that station (pictured) we handed out gift bags with Easter sugar cookies, chocolates, and other items . Not only did we share treats, we also shared moments of connecting: greeting old friends and new faces and passing on our Easter blessings and thanks for each person's participation in the event.





In early September, the team connected again in the church kitchen, prepping for Kick-Off Sunday. We happily hosted the food station (pictured) and connected with everyone who stopped by the food tent where the team provided hamburgers and hot dogs, pasta salad, and cookies. We are grateful for those opportunities to catch up with each other, sharing concerns and joys.

In October, we again connected around

food—*which seems to be our theme this year!* We joined together early on the afternoon of Trunk or Treat to prepare for the event: baking pans and pans of Mac and Cheese, heating hot dogs and making hot chocolate. Children's Ministry 2021

Similar to 2020, Children's Ministry looked very different in 2020 than previous years due to the challenges that COVID presented. Even so, we are grateful for the inperson events and programs we were able to offer children and families in mid-tolate-2021 after having to operate in a virtual capacity for over a year. These in-person gatherings included Vacation Bible School, Summer cooking/art camps, a Christmas Craft party, Trunk-or-Treat, Operation Christmas Child packing parties, and a new weekly youth group for preteens in the fall!

VBS & Other Events

With hopes to have an in-person Vacation Bible School in 2021, Children's Ministry decided in the spring to push VBS back to August. This caution paid off, as we were able to offer a fully inperson week of Vacation Bible School on August 8-12! As an additional precaution, the program was restructured with a mix of traditional,



children-only days (pictured), and days that consisted of outdoor family stations at Pettibone Park, Black River Beach, etc. Overall, 49 children participated in VBS 2021!

Children's ministry also hosted some additional outreach events for children & families in the latter-half of 2020, including cooking and art camps in the summer, Trunkor-Treat on October 24, and a Christmas Craft party in December. We are grateful for all of the leadership and volunteers that made all of our 2021 in-person events both possible and low-risk!

Preteen Youth Group

Looking ahead to another pandemic fall, and with Cindi reducing her hours (see below), Youth Director Alex decided to launch of 5-week series of youth group meetings for preteens (ages 9-12) beginning in September. The students had such a fun time at this program, we added a second set of 5 additional meetings in November and

December. The students spent two hours playing games, sharing a meal together, making crafts (pictured), and learning about God as our Creator (in September & October) and what made Jesus special (in November & December). The Children's Ministry Team is grateful for Libby and Taryn Winga, who volunteered their time and leadership to colead these meetings each and every week! Because the 10 meetings were so well-received by students, the Session approved additional funds for Children's Ministry to continue this Preteen Youth Group all throughout 2022!

What also made 2021 unique was that Cindi Kyte (pictured in a still from a 2021 Virtual Sunday School video) stepped down as Director of Children's Ministry after nearly two decades of serving children and families in that role. Cindi's gentleness, creativity, and positive energy made her an invaluable resource to Children's Ministry and the church as a whole! We cannot emphasize how grateful and blessed we are for her! Although we will miss her extensive involvement in Children's Ministry, we are grateful that she will continue to serve on the Team and in other areas of First Pres's ministry.

Youth Ministry 2021

Less is More!

2021 was not a very busy year for Youth Ministry. Due to the pandemic and Alex's summer sabbatical, there were no summer trips, no Spaghetti Dinner, no youth groups until September, and no outreach events. And although we missed some of these pre-pandemic highlights, we are deeply grateful for having more time, energy, and creativity to invest in the few programs we were able to do in 2021.

Confirmation Class of 2021

Confirmation became the main focus of Youth Ministry for the first five months of 2021. Taylor, Alex, and Cindi teamed up to lead a primarily virtual Confirmation program. The students met over zoom for class every other Wednesday night to learn basics of the Gospel message, the Bible, Reformed worship, Presbyterian governance, etc. In

between their weeks of classes, the students split into two age-specific groups to read and discuss the Gospel of Luke in a way that helped them engage with each chapter. As one student wrote in their faith statement, "In the span of a couple months of reading... Luke, I have learned many new things about what happened in The Bible. I found that reading the Bible makes more sense as I have grown, knowing that some stories are a bit advanced. But overall, the Bible has taught me about God and his ways, that he is always with us, and that everything happens for a reason." For their class project, the students decided together to do vard work in late April to prepare the church grounds for the summer (pictured). The students confirmed on May 23, 2021, are Caden Frost,



Bryn Moore, Owen Sobotta, Teddy Solberg, Jon James Ticku, and Taryn Winga.

Students Engaging in the Life and Ministry of First Pres

On one of our final Confirmation gatherings, the students took a survey designed to show them which ministry teams of the church would best fit their interests. By the end of 2021, at least half of the Confirmation class has been actively involved in other areas of the church, especially the Tech Team & Children's Ministry programs (the latter is pictured). We are grateful for the significant contribution these young men and women have made on the life and ministry of First Presbyterian Church!



Adult Ministries 2021

The Adult Ministries of First Presbyterian Church are represented primarily by the various Faith Nurture groups that meet on a weekly or monthly basis. We are grateful that two of these groups, which stopped meeting in 2020 due to COVID concerns, were able to start gathering again in 2021! Two other groups continued to meet regularly throughout 2020 and all of 2021, despite the everchanging policies regarding group gatherings. They shifted from virtual to in-person with masks, and then to in-person with optional masking...and then back to masks required and, most recently, back to virtual meetings. Therefore, as a church, we are grateful for the group leaders who have made these constant adjustments possible. We are also grateful for the persistent commitment that all group members have made to their respective groups, whether it was meeting virtually or patiently waiting for months to gather again. These groups and their participants keep Adult Ministries at First Pres alive and active!

In 2021, our Adult Ministry Groups included:

- **Sacred Rhythms** A women's group that meets monthly for chapter-by-chapter discussions of nonfiction Christian literature.
- Men's Bible Study A weekly Bible Study for men that meets on Wednesday mornings and studies a book of the Bible chapter-by-chapter.
- **Morning Circle** A group for senior women that studies scripture and meets monthly for 10 months out of the year
- Adult Education A weekly group for adults, which meets on Sunday mornings. For the past two years, this group has continued to follow a curriculum that takes groups through the entirety of the Bible.
